Q1. Diagonalize the following matrix, if it is diagonalizable (in the otherwise case give reasons in support of your answer):

$$A = \begin{bmatrix} 1 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 2 & 1 \\ 0 & 1 & 2 \end{bmatrix}$$

Also, write the algebraic and geometric multiplicities of all the eigenvalues of A. (Hint: One eigenvalue of the matrix A is 3).

Q2. State the Cauchy-Schwarz inequality for the inner product spaces. Moreover, using the Cauchy-Schwarz inequality for the vectors $x = [a \ b]^t$ and $y = [1 \ 1]^t$ in the inner product space \mathbb{R}^2 , show that $\left(\frac{a+b}{2}\right)^2 \leq \frac{a^2+b^2}{2}$.

Q3. Consider the vector space $\mathbb{P}_3([-1,1])$ equipped with inner product defined by: [7] [CO-3]

$$\langle p,q\rangle = \int_{-1}^{1} p(x)q(x)dx$$

Given the (ordered) basis $\{1, x, x^2, x^3\}$, use the Gram-Schmidt procedure to obtain an (ordered) orthogonal basis for $\mathbb{P}_3([-1,1])$.

Q4. Obtain the QR decomposition of the matrix $A = \begin{bmatrix} 1 & 1 & 1 & 1 \\ 2 & 0 & 2 & 0 \end{bmatrix}^t$. [5] [CO-4]

Q5. Test the consistency of the linear system Ax = b, where $A = \begin{bmatrix} 4 & 0 & 1 \\ 0 & 2 & 1 \end{bmatrix}^t$, and

$$\mathbf{b} = \begin{bmatrix} 2 & 0 & 11 \end{bmatrix}^t$$
